BACKGROUND

The NT Police Legacy was established as a charitable Organisation for the benefit of the surviving spouses and children of NT Police Officers, who have been killed, died on duty or died whilst serving, including those that have retired for reasons of ill health or age.

NTPL was established in 1990 with a grant of \$20,000 from the NTPA. The NTPA also established a payroll deduction system for members to donate directly to Northern Territory.

Police Legacy which continues today. Our charter is simple, to render aid, assistance and benefits to the Families of any Northern Territory Police Officers who died while in Service or in retirement. A very important part in the ongoing support of families to fallen police Officers is the NTPL.



LEGATEE COHORT

Northern Territory Police Legacy supports **50** legatee families, **23** of which have children under the age of 25 years old. The children reside across Australia, in the Northern Territory, Queensland, New South Wales, Australian Capital Territory, South Australia, Victoria and Western Australia.

GOVERANCE

The Board continues to review the constitution, policies, procedures, structure, grants and compliance to ensure we are contemporary and accountable.

Our financial position for a small jurisdiction is good. The financial statements continue to be audited by an independent body.

SOURCES OF INCOME

The majority of our income is derived from payroll deductions which are currently sitting at:

- \$5.00 per person/pay/fortnight 'the cost of a cup of coffee'
- 85% membership participation rate
- \$3.87 average contribution rate per person/pay

Fundraising to support NT Police Legacy is important and our future relies heavily on fundraising efforts and contributions from police officers.

EVENTS AND HIGHLIGHTS

NTPL Events have again this year have been limited due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The Kokoda Trek, WW1 Western front hike to Western France did not proceed, being postponed to 2022 with a commitment for the selected participants to attend where possible.

The National Police Memorial (NPM) PFA Wall to Wall 'Ride for Remembrance' event did not proceed in the normal format, culminating in satellite rides throughout the Northern Territory. The baton did make the journey, and was present at the ceremony in Canberra, and has returned to the Wall of Remembrance in Darwin on NPRD. Next year we hope to see the return this wonderful event.

The National Police Legacy Conference this year was a historic event being held virtually for the first time, in Melbourne with Victoria Police Legacy being the secretariat for 2021 and will be held in SA in 2022.

The National Police Remembrance Day was again the most significant day on the NTPL calendar. This day is a solemn occasion of remembrance for police officers, their families and the community.

We look forward to holding our Christmas gathering for NTPL Legatees, Legators and major stakeholders.
